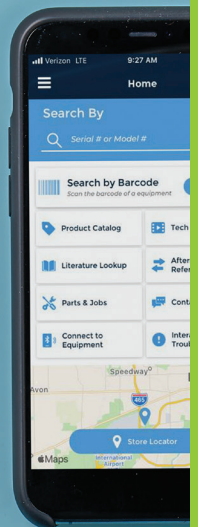
WHAT'S THE DAY-TO-DAY WORK LIKE FOR AN HVAC TECH?

In 2018, the median salary for HVAC technicians was \$47K/year and the top 10 percent of workers earned over \$76K/year without taking on college debt.* Most companies also offer great benefits – even to entry-level technicians – such as paid vacation, healthcare and 401(k).

WHAT KIND OF TRAINING IS REQUIRED?

Due to the current technician shortage, many companies will pay for qualified applicants to learn on the job. Some offer scholarships for students to attend a technical college where they'll learn the skills they need in as little as 12 months.
